OVER 6,650 ATLANTANS HELPED SHAPED PLAN

To connect with communities across Atlanta for Plan A, we hosted a series of virtual and in-person events, ranging from large public gatherings—including a Kick-off event, Open Houses, Workshops, and Community Meetings—to various types of smaller touchpoints such as Pop-Ups and Mobile Tours. These events provided opportunities for Atlantans to share their ideas, input, and feedback, which helped shape Plan A's draft as an actionable plan for Atlanta's future. Working together as residents and neighbors in the spirit of progress, our aim for Plan A was to create a citywide community vision to make an Atlanta that functions better for all people.





MAYOR'S OFFICE OF EQUITY, DIVERSITY, AND INCLUSION

(noun) MOEDI is the internal and external resource for ideas, practices and policies that operationalize Mayor Andre Dickens' Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) goals for the City of Atlanta. Our team does this work with an orientation towards systems change, efforts that provide education and resources to increase understanding of EDI and social justice issues, examine and change policies and practices that perpetuate inequalities, and build supportive and inclusive communities where all individuals feel valued, respected and belong.

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EQ·UI·TY

(noun) The state where predictability of success or failure is not correlated with identity or cultural markers such as race, gender, and sexual orientation.

(in action) Striving to identify and eliminate barriers that have prevented the full participation of some groups, increase justice and fairness within the procedures and processes of institutions or systems, as well as in their distribution of resources.

DI-VER-SI-TY

(noun) All the ways in which people differ, and it encompasses all the different characteristics that make one individual or group different from another. A broad definition includes not only race, ethnicity, and gender, but also age, national origin, religion, disability, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, education, marital status, language, and physical appearance.

IN-CLU-SION

(noun) The act of creating environments in which any individual or group can be and feel welcomed, respected, supported, and valued to fully participate. An inclusive and welcoming climate embraces differences and offers respect in words and actions for all people.


